

REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. What was the name of one of the cities Paul visited in today's story? (*Thessalonica; Berea; Athens.*)
2. What did the powerful men do to cause trouble against Paul, Silas, and Timothy? (*They gathered a mob and caused an uproar.*)
3. The people in Athens had a statue for a god just in case they missed one. What was it called? (*The unknown god.*)
4. What are ways you can worship God? (*Think about how awesome God is; sing praises to God; obey God's Word; answers may vary.*)
5. What is a philosopher? (*Someone who loves to think and talk about his thoughts.*)
6. What do you call something you worship more than God? (*An idol.*)
7. What is one of the three things about God that Paul told the people of Athens? (*God is our Creator; God is our Ruler; God is our Judge. [If needed, use the motions as a hint to help children remember.]*)
8. Why can God tell us what is right and wrong? (*Because He made everything and is in charge of the Earth.*)
9. Why did Jesus die? (*To take the punishment for my sin; to make a way for me to have a close friendship with God.*)
10. What did some of the philosophers do after they heard Paul teach? (*Some made fun of Paul; some said they would have to wait and talk to Paul again; some believed!*)
11. What happens to you when you believe in Jesus? (*My sins are forgiven; I'm no longer separated from God; I have eternal life.*)
12. With the help of your teammates, quote the memory verse for today. (*Romans 1:16.*)

PRESCHOOL REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. What is something God created? (*Answers will vary.*)
2. What did some of the people do after they heard Paul teach? (*Some believed.*)
3. What happened on the third day after Jesus died? (*He came back to life.*)
4. What do you have to do to be saved from sin? (*Believe on Jesus.*)

Review Game "Stand Up for God"

Instructions:

Start this game with the children sitting. Divide the children into teams. Ask questions alternating between teams. When a child answers correctly he gets to stand up for the rest of the game. (If he answers a question while standing, he may pick another member of his team to stand as well.) The team with the most children standing at the end of the game wins.

Variation:

When a question is answered correctly, everyone on that team claps together one time.

Preschool Review Game "Stand Up for God Junior"

Play the game as described above, but do not divide into teams or declare a winner. If possible, repeat so all children have a chance to answer a question and stand.
