

REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. Where did Paul want to go? (*Rome.*)
2. What message did Paul want everyone to know? (*The Good News of Jesus.*)
3. What is the worst part about sin? (*It separates me from God; I can't have a friendship with God now and one day I will be separated from all of God's goodness forever.*)
4. Why was Paul a prisoner? (*Because he was telling others about Jesus.*)
5. Who appeared to Paul and told him that he would go to Rome? (*Jesus.*)
6. What did the sailors do to lighten the ship? (*They threw everything overboard.*)
7. Why is it impossible for God to break His promises? (*Because He is faithful; it's who He is.*)
8. What did God promise Paul? (*That Paul would go to Rome; that everyone on the ship would be saved.*) Did God keep His promise? (*Yes!*)
9. Where can you find the promises God has for those who believe in Him? (*In God's Word, the Bible.*)
10. How long did the storm last? (*14 days.*)
11. How many people on the ship were saved from the storm? (*All 276 of them.*)
12. How can you have a friendship with God? (*Believe in Jesus to have everlasting life.*)

PRESCHOOL REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. Where did Paul want to go? (*Rome.*)
2. Why can you trust God? (*He keeps His promises.*)
3. How many of the people on the ship were saved from the storm? (*All of them.*)
4. How can you have a friendship with God? (*Believe on Jesus to have everlasting life.*)

Review Game "Lighten the Load"

Materials:
Box, basket, or bag for each team
Six items for each basket

Instructions:
Divide the children into teams. Have a box, basket, or bag representing a ship for each team. Place the "ships" at the front of the room. Put six objects such as small books, rocks, or toys into each "ship". Remind the children that the sailors in the story threw cargo overboard to lighten the ship during the storm. Ask questions, alternating between the teams. Each time a child answers correctly, let him come up and remove an object from his team's "ship." The team with the lightest load at the end of the game wins.

Preschool Review Game "Lighten the Load Junior"

Play the game as described above but do not divide into teams or decide a winner. If possible, repeat so all children have a chance to answer a question and remove an object.
