

REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. Where was Paul when he wrote the letter to the Ephesians? (*Rome; prison.*)
2. Why did Paul write the letter instead of going and visiting the church? (*Paul was a prisoner and couldn't leave Rome.*)
3. How can you stand firm? (*Put on the Armor of God; trust God and His strength to help me each day.*)
4. What does temptation mean? (*Wanting to do something that goes against God.*)
5. What kinds of things tempt you to sin? (*Answers will vary.*)
6. What did a Roman soldier wear to keep him from slipping? (*His shoes.*)
7. What is one of the pieces of armor and what does it mean for you? (*Answers will vary.*)
8. When you believe on Jesus, what does God see instead of your sin? (*Jesus' righteousness.*)
9. How can remembering your salvation help you? (*I can be confident that God is with me and will help me no matter what; I don't need to be afraid or discouraged; answers may vary.*)
10. What has God given us to fight against Satan? (*The Sword of the Spirit; Word of God; the Bible.*)
11. How can you have victory over temptation? (*Ask God for help; think about the Armor of God and pretend to put it on; choose to do what is right.*)
12. With the help of your team, quote the memory verse we learned today. (*Ephesians 6:10.*)

Review Game "Armor of God Dress Up"

Materials:
"Armor of God Dress Up" reproducibles
(See GNC Resource Pack.)

Instructions:
Divide the children into teams. Have one picture of a Roman soldier and a set of armor per team at the front of the room. When a child answers correctly, he may place one of the pieces of armor onto his team's soldier. His team then stands and says the name of that piece while doing the motion learned during the lesson. The team whose soldier has the most armor at the end of the game wins.

Variation:
Create child-sized suits of armor using cardboard and dress up one representative from each team.

Preschool Review Game "Armor of God Dress Up Junior"

Play as described, but do not divide into teams or decide a winner. If possible, repeat so all children have a chance to answer a question and put a piece of armor on the soldier.
